What is the PLANNING HIGH-QUALITY PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT tip sheet and how can you use it?

Developed by Bellwether Education Partners for the Summer Learning Toolkit, this tip sheet offers advice for summer program leaders as they begin to plan their pre-program professional development. Tips are organized by goals, planning, and content sections and offer research-based recommendations for structuring your time most effectively to cover all essential topics.

Why is high-quality professional development important?

Professional development is central to ensuring that program goals and plans translate into positive experiences for youth and staff, and ultimately, a benefit for those who attend. [RAND](#) recommends that program and professional development leaders:

- Intentionally highlight program goals and expectations of youth and staff, including strategies for promoting positive climate and culture. Reference data about the families and students being served to make the case for why the summer experience and program elements are important.
- Dedicate time for teachers and staff to both learn about and practice with curriculum and instructional materials or activities.
- Include all instructional support staff in curriculum training and practice sessions with teachers to increase the likelihood that they'll be effective in their roles.
- Model appropriate behavior management strategies and approaches to ensure a unified approach and clear expectations throughout the day.
